



Houston County, Georgia, USA

Houston County covers approximately 400 square miles and contains 3 incorporated cities; Centerville, Perry, Warner Robins. Houston County is part of the Macon-Warner Robins Metropolitan Statistical Area and enjoys close proximity to interstates, highways, airports and some rail access. The county has direct access to Interstate 75 with Interstate 16 located less than 20 miles to the east. In addition, 10 US and State highways pass through the county. Houston County also has access to air transportation via 3 airports. The county is home to its own general aviation airport, the Perry-Houston County Airport, which has a 5,002' runway. The nearest commercial airport, Macon Lewis B. Wilson Airport, has a 6,500' runway and is located approximately 20 miles northeast of Houston County. The nearest international airport, Atlanta's Hartsfield-Jackson Airport, is located approximately 100 miles north of the county.

Houston County has been experiencing unparalleled growth, growing from a population of 89,208 in 1990 to a population of 131,016 in 2007. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the population of Houston County in 2015 is projected to be 160,698. From 1990 to 2000, the population grew by 24.2 percent and by 18.3% percent just in the 7 years between 2000 and 2007. Employers in Houston County enjoy access to an available labor force in excess of 180,000 within a 30-minute drive time. Houston County's skilled workforce can be attributed to a number of factors including its nationally acclaimed public and private school system along with the 5 colleges and universities and 2 technical colleges in the area.
